



The School Uniform represents the values of the School. It is modern, comfortable and emphasises gender equality. Students should positively represent the School at all times by wearing the uniform with pride. The wearing of the school uniform and general appearance of students should be in line with appropriate community standards. The School Principal or delegate will determine the application of this principle where required.

General Guidelines

Please note the following general guidelines about wearing the uniform:

- All uniform items apart from bathers must be purchased through the School's official supplier. Generic items are not allowed.
- Only the defined school uniform as outlined may be worn at school and when travelling to and from school.
- Blazers are compulsory for students in Years 10 to 12. Blazers are to be worn to and from school all year round except on declared "blazer free days" or on days when the temperature is over 30 degrees. Years 10-12 students are not to appear in public with their jumper as the outer garment.
- The academic uniform and the sport uniform should not be mixed in any way.
- Sun-hats must be worn when necessary for sun protection (please refer to UV policy for more information).
- Summer and Winter uniform should not be mixed.
- All uniform items must be clearly labelled with your child's surname.
- Shorts, skirts and dresses must all be of appropriate lengths. Shorts must reach mid-thigh or below. Skirts and dresses must reach at most 5cm from the top of the student's knees.

Academic Uniform

Summer

- School dress
- Shirt – pale blue short/ long sleeved
- Shorts or pants – navy blue pinstripe
- Socks – Plain navy blue or black socks (no branding)

Winter

- Skirt – navy blue pinstripe
- Shorts or pants – navy blue pinstripe
- Shirt – pale blue short/long sleeved
- Navy tights or navy blue socks with skirts (no ankle socks)
- Socks – Plain navy blue or black socks (no branding)

Applicable for both options

- Vest or Pullover
- Shoes – Black leather, leather-appearance standard school shoes or all black sneakers.
- TKDS blazer (Year 10 to Year 12) **Not required on days when the temperature is over 30 degrees
- Sandals – Plain navy/black sandals for hot days (Prep to Year 2 - optional)
- Black leather or leather-appearance belt with small silver buckle (optional)
- White short sleeve undershirt may be worn underneath the short sleeve shirt
- White long sleeve undershirt may be worn underneath the long sleeve shirt

Optional items

- Scarves and Beanies– navy only
- Bike shorts – Navy blue to be worn under school skirts or dresses.
- Spray Jacket – May be worn over the blazer if it is raining or at any time for Prep - Year 9

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Sport uniform

If students have Sport or Physical Education classes, they may travel to and from school in their Sport Uniform. On those days students wear their Sport Uniform all day. Please note that there are no House coloured tops as students receive a sash or bib when in House competitions. Team tops will be supplied by the School for Inter School sporting events as required. Under no circumstances are students to mix and match items of the Academic Uniform and the Sport Uniform.

- Polo Shirt – navy blue, long/short sleeved
- Shorts – navy blue
- Track pants – navy blue
- Polar fleece long sleeved Top – navy Blue
- Polar fleece vest – navy blue
- Swimwear: No bikinis are allowed. Students can choose between navy blue one-piece bathers or navy shorts/bathers. A rashie is also required.
- Sports Shoes - both white and coloured runners may be worn. Please be mindful that patterns or logos on shoes should not contain any disrespectful images.
- White short sleeve undershirt may be worn underneath the short sleeve polo shirt
- White long sleeve undershirt may be worn underneath the long sleeve polo shirt

Other items

- TKDS Kippah
- School bag with school emblem
- Bucket style Sun-hat (Prep to Year 12)
- TKDS Year 12 rugby top (Year 12 only) to be worn under the blazer. Does not replace the blazer. The appropriate shirt must be worn under the rugby top.

General Appearance

Please note the following rules with regard to personal appearance.

- Hair must be neat and tidy
- P-5: Long hair must be tied back
- 6-12: Long hair must be tied back for Science, Physical Education and Sport and on formal occasions.
- Natural looking hair colour
- No extreme hairstyles
- Short and tidy facial hair
- Natural looking, light make up
- Natural looking nail polish (colours not permitted)
- Nail length must allow students to engage in all activities safely
- One small nose stud is allowed. No other facial or other visible piercings permitted
- Small hoops (no greater than 1cm diameter), sleepers and stud earrings only (Max 3 per ear)
- The only jewellery that may be worn are a Jewish symbol on a chain around the neck

Casual Clothes

- Students must be presentable and should wear clothes that are suitable for school.
- No singlets or midriff tops.
- Appropriate closed-toed shoes
- Students must bring a brimmed hat in line with our school SunSmart policy.
- Students will need to wear appropriate clothing when they have PE classes and will be required to either bring or wear sports uniform when they have interschool sport.
- When swimwear is required, bikinis are not permitted. Students should wear one-piece bathers or shorts and a top.

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
