### How to Enrol

The Music Enrolment Form is located in the myKDS under Student Area.

### Conditions of Enrolment for Music Lessons

- For known appointments, 24 hours notice must be given (dentist, specialist etc).
- If a child wakes up ill, notice must be provided to the music instructor by 8.00am on the day of the lesson, otherwise the lesson will be charged at the usual rate.
- If sufficient notice is provided, all attempts will be made to make-up the missed lesson at a later date.
- Lessons missed by staff or due to a clash between the lesson and another School commitment are made up or reimbursed at the end of every semester.
- Students in Prep to Year 5 will be collected from class at their appointed lesson time.



## Ensembles

In order to establish fundamental reading and group-performance skills (e.g. tuning, coordination, balance, sight reading, rehearsal technique etc.), students receiving instrumental lessons at the School are encouraged to be involved in our ensemble program. Ensembles rehearse weekly and perform at school events including concerts, assemblies and school musicals. Please note, the rehearsal times listed are subject to change.

## Coding

## MERIT

WHO:

Years 3-5

WHERE:

Science Lab / Art Room

CAPACITY:

Maximum of 18 students. Parents must sign up students via the form on the myKDS.

DESCRIPTION:

The MERIT program (Making, Engineering, Robotics and Information Technology) is a co-curricular program that encourages curious and creative learning through a broad range of practical learning experiences.

The Junior MERIT program activities are a combination of usually two to three (structured) learning activities for students as well as free-choice for students. Activities are centred around one of three levels: observer (watch and learn), tinkerer (pull down/build up/try something new) and creator (design and build).

Past activities have included:

- Art: pendulum painting, plaster, play-dough, wood art.
- Festivals: creation of wooden dreidels
- Robotics challenges with programming and engineering challenges.
- Electronics and simple circuits: light up cards and making a game controller using conductive materials.
- Materials and properties of materials: cardboard constructions, make a maze or a game, marble run activities, balanced, unbalanced and counter-balancing materials, magnets.
- Making: creating a hovercraft, spaghetti tower, paper cup catapult, sound spinners and loom band construction.

## After School Clinics

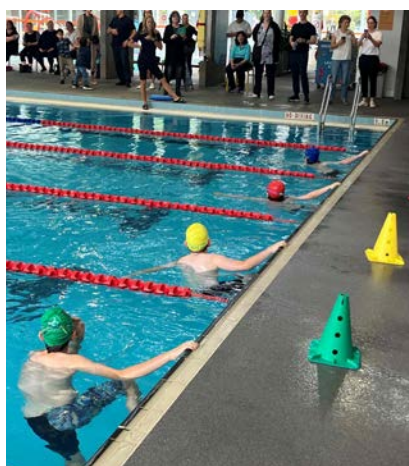

# Co-Curricular - Leadership Opportunities

Encouraging students to be 'upstanders' who now and in the future will assume leadership roles within the School, the Jewish community and beyond is of central importance at King David. Student leadership, activism and voice are promoted through a number of avenues.

In their final year in Junior School, all Year 5 students elect to be on a particular *Vaad* (committee), charged with leading and taking ownership over a particular area of school life, including *Ruach* (school spirit), *Yahadut* (Jewish life), *Tikkun Olam* (social action), *Iton* (newspaper), Sport, *Ichut Sviva* (environment) and Media.

### Art/Drawing

WHO:

Prep - Year 5

DESCRIPTION:

- Draw with me, drawing what the teacher draws on the whiteboard one line at a time.
- Draw with the video, following instructions on a drawing video.

### Conditions of Enrolment for Music Lessons

- For Years 6 -12 students a condition of receiving instrumental/voice lessons at The King David School is weekly involvement in an ensemble after their first year of lessons.
- For known appointments, 24 hours notice must be given (dentist, specialist etc).
- If a child wakes up ill, notice must be provided to the music instructor by 8.00am on the day of the lesson, otherwise the lesson will be charged at the usual rate.
- If sufficient notice is provided, all attempts will be made to make-up the missed lesson at a later date. Lessons missed by staff or due to a clash between the lesson and another School commitment are made up or reimbursed at the end of every semester.
- Students in Years 6-12 are expected to make their own way to their lesson.





## Ensembles

In order to establish fundamental reading and group-performance skills (e.g. tuning, coordination, balance, sight reading, rehearsal technique etc.), it is compulsory for all students in Years 6-12 who are in their second year or beyond of receiving instrumental lessons at the School to be involved in our ensemble program. Upon teacher advice, students who are not in their second year may also be asked to join their relevant ensemble. Ensembles rehearse weekly and perform at school events including concerts, assemblies and school musicals.

## Audition Conditions

1. Roles are determined by the panel: Head of Theatre and Productions, Head of Music, relevant HOS or delegate, other performing arts staff member(s).

The panel considers the following factors:

- (a) Ability
  - (b) Suitability
  - (c) Participation
2. The opportunity to audition is subject to the following conditions (to be acknowledged by parents via the myKDS, prior to the audition):
    - (a) No photographs, videos, costuming or other supporting material to be submitted as part of the audition
    - (b) Attendance of at least 80% of rehearsals
    - (c) Attendance of 100% of Dress Rehearsals (e.g. Three Sundays, Two Wednesdays before a show)
    - (d) The casting decisions of the panel are final and not open to negotiation
    - (e) The casting decisions are confidential
    - (f) The audition process may involve call backs in order to finalise casting

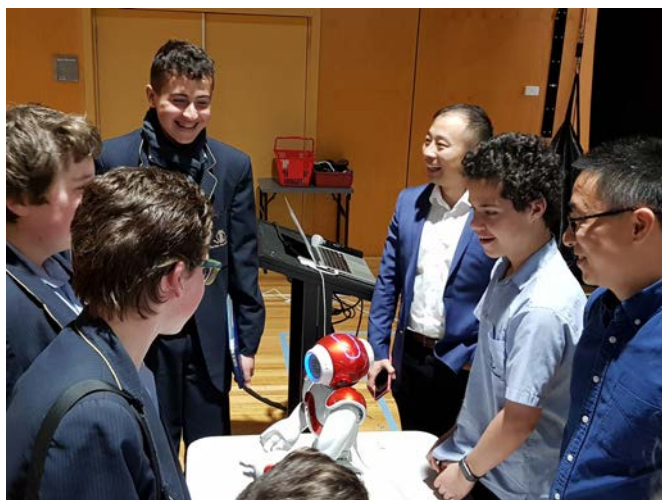

## Team Selections

At the start of each term, students select which sport they would like to join. If there are more students than required in a particular sport, then try outs will occur. The top performing students will then be selected for the teams and remaining students will be redirected to other sports that require more participants.

Once students have been selected in a sport they must commit to the team and to training sessions as arranged by their coach.

A golf program and a wellness program are also offered to students during Years 8-12 during allocated sports time.

## Uniform

Full sports uniform is to be worn on each day PE or Sport is timetabled, and when competing in inter-school competitions. Refer to the myKDS for sports uniform requirements.

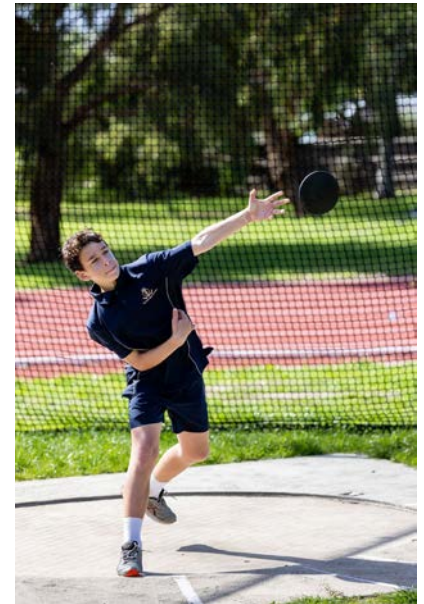

## Co-Curricular - Leadership Opportunities

Encouraging students to be 'upstanders' who now and in the future will assume leadership roles within the School, the Jewish community, and beyond is of central importance in the School. Student leadership and voice are promoted through a number of avenues.

At the Magid campus, students from each year level serve on the Kol Echad (One Voice - Student Action Committee), which provides a forum for raising concerns, sharing ideas and organising social justice and fund-raising projects. All Year 10 students participate in Derech, a program in which leadership capacity is developed through explicit training and opportunities to facilitate sessions with younger students. Year 11 students have the opportunity to mentor Year 7 students in Amit, our peer leadership program.

As Year 11 students approach their final year in the school, they may stand for a position on the Hanhagah, the school's peak student leadership body consisting of elected representatives (*Manhigim*) serving on four *va'adot* (committees), including *Yahadut* (Jewish life), *Ruach* (school spirit), *Tikkun Olam* (social justice) and *Tarbut* (art).

The Hanhagah meets weekly with the Jewish Experiential Education team and school leaders to discuss initiatives and plan events. It plays a central role in driving student engagement in Jewish life activities and building school spirit and culture. Members are offered leadership training and mentoring.



# Other Clubs & Activities

Many of our clubs are student-run, often by members of the Hanhagah (Year 12 leaders). Accordingly, they change based on students' interests. Current examples of clubs include Art Club, Chess Club, Advanced Dungeons and Dragons, and Friday T'filah.
